2022 Semi-Annual Congregational Meeting Minutes - May 30, 2022

1. **Call to Order** - Board Chair, Justin Thomas. Justin welcomed everybody and called the meeting to order.
2. **Motion to Adopt Agenda** - Moved: Elsa Guenther. Seconded Lisa Hrycan. Carried.
3. **Scripture and Opening Prayer** - Pastor Rick McCorkindale. Pastor Rick read from Luke 12, the parable of the rich fool.
4. **Motion to Appoint Head Teller and Parliamentarian** - Motion to appoint Nathan Unruh as head teller by Duane Guenther. Seconded: Evangeline Patkau. Carried. Motion to appoint Dennis Ens as parliamentarian by Clayton Lane. Seconded: Nathan Unruh. Carried.
5. **Adoption of Minutes - 2022 Annual General Meeting Minutes** - Motion to adopt the minutes of January 25, 2022 AGM by Karin McGill. Seconded: Joanne Thomas. Carried.
6. **Business Arising from Minutes** - There was no business arising from the minutes.
7. **Attendance Registration Report** - 37 members and 1 adherent attending (online and in-person combined):
8. **Auditor's Report Summary** - Dale Derksen, Board Treasurer. The report came back clean, nothing was raised as needing our attention. No questions were asked.
9. **Financial Update** - Dale Derksen, Board Treasurer
Looking at this year's to-date financial situation, we are not in the best position: Giving is \$95,000 behind budget which means it is \$85,000 behind expenses. The Board and the Facility & Finance Team will be working on ways to solve this problem and welcome input.
Question: How up to date are these figures? Answer: They include the giving figures for up to and including May 22, 2022.
Dale stated that the reserve fund and the cash position of the church is still in good shape.
Question: Do we know if the number of givers has gone down or is it just the amounts? Answer: Compared with a few years ago, the number of givers is down but compared to last year, it's the same number of givers but amounts are down.
Justin said that the Board will be making a statement on the church financial situation to the whole congregation in a couple of weeks.
10. **Motion - Surplus Update** - Michael Streilein. Michael explained that part of the original agreed plan for sharing the Missions and Service Team's portion of the fund surplus from last year needs to be changed. Originally \$4,000 was going to be given to the Love Bus to help pay for maintenance. However the bus is not fixable. The committee is going to give \$500 to another bus providing the same mission as the Love Bus to help them with costs and would like permission to reallocate the rest of the money to the camp sponsorship fund. Motion: To reallocate \$3,500 that had been earmarked for the Love Bus to the camp sponsorship fund - Michael Streilein. Seconded by Kathy Janzen. Voted by ballot.
11. **Q & A**
Questions: As the Board will be discussing ideas for fixing the budget, does this include the rental money? How are rentals this year? Also will the financial situation affect the plan to fill the Senior Pastor position?
Answer: The Board has been talking about measures that might be taken if necessary, but the timeline for deciding measures is in the fall. The Board will need to discuss any plans with Dawn once she returns from her sabbatical.
Julie Tsui, chair of Facilities and Finance - All ministry teams were asked to suspend non-essential spending. The church is open for rentals again but there haven't been many enquiries this year. Pre-covid, rental income would be around \$20,000 annually. However, rental income is never included in budget calculations.



The Board has decided to look for a quarter-time senior pastor position and they are now working on the next stages of organizing that search.

Questions: Could the rental income affect our charitable status?

Answer: No, the rental income isn't sizeable enough to affect it.

As I reflect back on 2022, it truly has been a heavy year for many of us that call Cornerstone Church our home. Loved ones lost, inflation creating pressure for everyone, and having to look very closely at our church's budget. As most should be aware, in 2022, we've been behind on giving in comparison to our budget, even more so than the last few years. This has led to many conversations and taking a hard look at what that means for our church moving forward. Many churches in Saskatoon have been having these conversations, and we are no different. Significant work has occurred to help bring down budget costs, while still keeping in mind the vision and goals of our church, when it comes to discipleship and reaching out to our community, and focusing on our missions outreach/support.

We also will see a few changes in terms of our staffing at Cornerstone Church.

Pastor Rick is retiring at the end of January, 2023. That date is fast approaching. As we get closer to that date, the board and our Executive Pastor (Dawn Grunau), have been discussing next steps regarding this position. A large part of Cornerstone Church is our Sunday morning services, ensuring that the congregation is fed spiritually each week. We are excited to have Pastors

Dawn, Michael and Austin take on monthly preaching along with congregation members and other partner organizations coming to preach as well. We also recognize the amount of work that the Pastors already do, and to take on this load is not sustainable long-term. As such, the board has approved creating a search committee for our next teaching/shepherding pastor. This process will take some time, and that final approval will come from a vote of church membership. It is important to note that we do not expect to have a new teaching pastor until the last half of 2023, but most likely closer to fall of 2023. We ask everyone who calls this church home to join us in prayer as we fervently seek God's direction in this.

Elsa Guenther resigned from her position of Cornerstone Church Administrator in early December. We appreciate her dedication and will truly miss her in that role and we wish her all the best in her new career.

Kathy Janzen has been a dedicated employee of Cornerstone Church in the role of Administrative Assistant for over 28 years. Kathy resigned from her position effective December 31st. We appreciate Kathy in all the years of service she has dedicated to this church.

Joanne Thomas has added

the Administrative Assistant role, adding hours to her current role. Pastor Dawn and the Facility and Finance Team are excited to have Becca McKee join us in the Church Administrator role. She is already a blessing to our church family and we know she will be a great fit on our staff team!

As we recognize the financial difficulties our church is going through, we must ensure that we are being good stewards of what God has given us, and to depend on Him for guidance. As we reflect on our church's needs and opportunities, as well as our budgeting reality, we will also continue to look at the overall staffing requirements and structure in 2023.

The board had originally approved to proceed with a quarter-time Pastor to Seniors starting around fall 2022, however we felt it best to suspend this position indefinitely. Our focus will be on the recruitment of a new teaching pastor who will be suitable to take on the roles of the Pastor to Seniors as well.

There are so many good things that God continues to do within our church! It has been great to see baptisms, membership and child dedications happening, and to see the community outreach that our church continues to do. Our church is filled with passionate, dedicated people, and with that, I believe we have the foundation to continue to

seek, obey and reflect Jesus, and to see us accomplish God's mission for the church.

In the near future, the board will be bringing forward updated Purpose, Mission, Vision and Value statements to the congregation which will help to provide clarity of direction for Cornerstone Church, and where we (the board and staff) believe God wants us to go as His Body. From this, there will be very intentional steps taken by staff in terms of goals that we as a Church want to meet. As those goals are brought forward, we look forward to getting the congregation on board and excited for the future things to happen at Cornerstone Church.

As we move through this next year, I'm reminded of Proverbs 3:5-6. God has great plans for our church, and we need to put our trust in Him, that He's got all things in His hands. Because of that, I can only be excited for what the next years will bring for Cornerstone.

Vision & Ends Statement

In 2020, the Board took the opportunity to renew our vision for Cornerstone and we are excited to share it with you. It comes in two parts. The first is the "Vision Statement" and it is something that is directed at everyone, from our kids to our 55+, staff and congregation alike. We can all say it together, and then live it out together.

Cornerstone's Vision Statement:
"We are a community of disciples who passionately seek, obey & reflect Jesus"

The second statement is called an "Ends Statement". We are adopting this format due to the way our governance is set up (Policy Governance). This declares what the purpose of Cornerstone Church is by stating what will end up happening. We are happy to share it with everyone, but it is written as a directive to the staff, Management Team and all church leadership. It is a tool for them to make decisions and weigh options and let them know what is expected. It is followed by Definitions/ Interpretations which go into more detail clarifying what is meant and the scriptures behind the statement.

Ends Statement:
"Cornerstone Church is a Great Commandment, Great Commission church that equips disciples who passionately seek, obey and reflect Jesus"

Definitions/Interpretations:

Great Commandment – Matthew 22:37-39

³⁷ Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself'."

1. Cornerstone Church cultivates an atmosphere where we recognize that our created purpose and number one priority as disciples is to ***Love God in all three persons of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.***
2. Cornerstone Church actively ***Loves Others*** – Caring for and serving everyone and anyone, both locally and globally.

Great Commission – Matthew 28:18-20

¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.'"

3. Cornerstone Church is a vibrant community of authentic relationships, supporting each other and ***going out*** to engage with our neighbours, locally and globally.
4. Cornerstone Church ***makes disciples*** who reflect Jesus and are capable and intentional in reproducing followers of Jesus. This is accomplished through baptism and biblically centered teaching.
5. Cornerstone Church recognizes that discipleship is a journey of relationship with Jesus that is accessible to all ages and that all people are at some stage of that journey.

Jesus is the Cornerstone.

Our church's name proclaims Jesus as foundational to everything we do. He must be our only hope, our only desire, and our only salvation. "Jesus is 'The stone you builders rejected, which has become the cornerstone.' Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:11-12).

2022 has tested our resolve to believe and live out the truth that Jesus alone is our salvation, and the need to share that with the world! Our circumstances do not affect the truth of Jesus and I am very thankful for that!

I was blessed by you all to be able to go on Sabbatical from mid-April until mid-August in 2022. I want to say a huge 'thank you' to the staff who made this possible, by filling in for me, especially to Joanne as she took all of the Family Ministry responsibilities. My sabbatical was filled with finishing some school assignments, beginning my Masters of Arts degree as well as lots of time with my family. I was also gifted lots of time to pray, read scripture, and listen to God. During this time God taught me many things and I would like to share parts of that with you.

First, God told me that even though 2022 was already hard, another difficult season was yet to come. I

had a clear sense that God was going to remove what we, as a church, were relying on outside of Him, in order to deepen our dependence on Him. In many ways I have seen this happen as we have seen struggles with attendance, finances, having volunteers, staffing transitions, and more. I am thankful for the leadership of the church; board, staff, and ministry teams, who continue to faithfully seek what God is teaching us in this time. Hard is not necessarily bad and as we rely on God and humble ourselves in prayer, He is moving and directing our hearts.

I have been encouraged by many who shared they are praying for our church and I hope to see a stronger attendance at our corporate prayer times, now always on Wednesdays. "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, I am there among them." (Matthew 18:20).

Secondly, God told me to take more opportunities to teach from the Bible. Up until then, I was mostly teaching online each Monday and I was not sure what other opportunities would look like, but I was willing and excited to say 'yes' to opportunities as they arose. With Pastor Rick retiring at the end of January 2023, Pastors Austin, Michael, and I have discerned how to fill the important ministry of teaching on Sunday

mornings while we search for a teaching/shepherd pastor. Beginning in February we will each teach once a month and the other Sundays people from our church as well as ministry organizations will teach us. We are excited to hear from a variety of people, but in order to provide some continuity, we will all be preaching through the Gospel of Mark.

The last part I will share is the sense this season will be a refining time that is going to bring renewal and revival. As we deepen in our relationship with God and with others, we are going to have times of repentance, confessing, and awkward conversations, but we will also experience being merciful with one another and the freedom that comes when we bring our sin and weaknesses before God. For some time, I have been concerned about what is being spoken in the dark; the side conversations/texts, rumors, and gossip. I do not want anybody to feel that they cannot have or bring forward any concerns or issues they may have, but when we do not take them to the right people, those who have the responsibility for the offense or confusion, it is divisive and destructive to the Body and it hinders God's purposes. I know sharing these things can be uncomfortable, but when we speak to one another, coming together in humility, eager to listen and truly hear one another, there is ZERO

room for the enemy to deceive! "Walk as children of light- for the fruit of the light consists of all goodness, righteousness, and truth- testing what is pleasing to the Lord. Do not participate in the fruitless works of darkness, but instead expose them" (Ephesians 5:8b-11).

Cornerstone's leadership is working hard to look to God for direction during all the changes that have been happening. The pastoral staff and the board have been working on our Mission, Purpose, Vision, and Values (PMVV). Although this is a transition year, as we look to hire a teaching/shepherding pastor, we want to continue to do the broader work of caring for the congregation, empowering leaders, engaging with our community, and developing disciples and the staff team have created action steps to grow in each of these areas.

We want to continue being good stewards of everything God has blessed us, including our amazing volunteers! It has been difficult at times to find enough people to serve, so to better utilize our volunteers, the Student Ministries and Family Ministries team will be combining for an interim amount of time.

We have seen God's Spirit moving in the last few months, bringing a

renewed sense of purpose and hope for our church, and I am excited to see what God has in store for His church. There are new people coming into our building every Sunday, our children and youth programs are reaching students in the community each week, financial giving

has increased in the past few months, our neighborhood knows that Cornerstone is a church that cares for people in our community and, most exciting, we have people making decisions to follow Jesus as their Lord!

I am looking forward to

seeing how the Body of Cornerstone moves and works towards God's purposes for 2023!

Lead Pastor - Rick McCorkindale

When I began writing this report, I was in week 5 of repeated illnesses - colds/flu/infections/bronchitis. I was feeling sick, weary and a little hopeless. Worn down and frustrated because, having announced my retirement, I was wanting to "end well" - literally and figuratively. And believe me, you do not want to read those early notes... but last week I took sick days - full days off - to just start "getting well." Lots of sleep, more antibiotics, more sleep and a puffer seem to have been steps toward healing.

Now that opening paragraph isn't meant as preparation for retirement coffee hour, I think it is descriptive of the Church's condition these days. We are sick and weary. We feel like we are dealing with one crisis after another - deficits - declining attendance - retirements - resignations - rumours - a lack of patience - frustration - divisiveness - and a sense of hopelessness. And, while parts apply to Cornerstone, it is the current wider experience of the North America Church in general.

Healthwise, I think I'm finally on the road to recovery. But what about the Church - and our church? My experience reminds me that resting and a good night sleep help; that stepping back can bring perspective (even when there's no immediate change in circumstances). So, what's my Rx to the Church? And prayer for Cornerstone?

To rest requires trust. The ability to relinquish and relax. The New Zealand Church includes this prayer in its liturgy: "Lord, it is night. The night is for stillness. Let us be still in the presence of God. It is night after a long day. What has been done has been done; what has not been done has not been done; let it be. The night is dark. Let our fears of the darkness of the world and of our own lives rest in You." Can I encourage us to begin by **resting in the Lord**? Committing our fears and hopes to Him in the confident trust that Jesus is still at work in His Church and will yet "present her to Himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless." (Ephesians 5:27 NIV-UK)

Resting in the Lord doesn't mean sitting back and doing nothing but it means actively seeking and relying on Him and His wisdom and insight. In these days of new things and new situations we need to recall that God is in control and indeed has always been in the business of making all things new - whether that's our old worn hearts or all of creation! He is surprised by none of what we face and calls on us to rest in His love, provision and direction.

Reluctantly, I also prescribe taking our medicine. As we've met on Tuesday and Wednesdays for prayer 2 Chronicles 7:14 has given direction: "If My people, who

are called by My name, will humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land." (NIV-UK) While it was easy to blame Covid, the flu or RSV for my condition I have to face up to the fact that I quit washing my hands as much as I did. And I touch my face and nose all the time. We can't blame others for the condition of the Church - the big, bad government or any of the other current scapegoats. I have to confess my sin - my apathy - my divisive spirit - my hopelessness - my eagerness to take control - my unwillingness to seek His face and busy myself with other diversions and activities.

Only then will we come back to health - only then will He heal our land. "But, if we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive our sins, and purify us from all our unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9)

This is my last annual report as part of our Pastoral Staff so I want to thank you for the privilege of serving you these past eight years. It has been my joy to study God's Word each week and share what, I pray, was His message, more than 300 times. I have loved being part of a beautiful team of staff who all bring their character, skills and passion for Jesus to their work. And I

have appreciated so much the volunteers who work alongside and lead so many of the ministries in this church. In particular my thanks to the Spiritual Care Team and Karin McGill for their unending efforts to minister to the wide needs of this body.

I love you, people of Cornerstone. I have been blessed to walk alongside many of you in the ups and downs of ordinary life, trying to encourage you in the way of Jesus. I have been blessed by our common desire to see Jesus more and more in our lives and my prayer for Cornerstone is that we will continue to be a growing light in this part of Saskatoon and beyond. May people see our good works and glorify our Father who is in heaven, and may we have the joy of seeing them join us as we seek, obey and reflect Jesus!

Spiritual Care - Karin McGill

"And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up. So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith. (Ephesians 6:9-10)

The Spiritual Care Ministry Team continues to serve the congregation and community through prayer, various helps, calls, visitation, communion, and managing the Benevolent Fund.

The Benevolent Fund this year, through the generous donations of many, has been utilized in a variety of ways:

- **CHEP Good Food**
Boxes went out monthly to approximately 23 families, but ended in October with the indefinite closing of the program. In November we supplied recipients with eggs and a gift card to help with the sudden closure, and in December, Christmas hampers went out.
- **The Food Closet**
inhouse continues to provide emergency food aid to anyone with a need.
- A handful of people had expenses arise with no other means of providing for their needs. After careful consideration, referring to the policy that

governs the fund, we were able to participate in helping them out.

Baptism has been celebrated a few times this year with more people making their commitment to Jesus public; honouring God with the visual representation of His great Gift of Salvation.

Adult Sunday School has been running smoothly, thanks to those who plan, lead, and participate.

Communion has gone through significant changes this past year, as have many things, and we are happy to again serve the congregation in a model that we understand best reflects the Lord's Supper.

We pass the bread and the juice (representing the wine) to serve one another, take time to reflect/repent of what the Holy Spirit brings to our attention, and partake

together in faith.

Communion, for us believers, is a continual reminder of the covenant that God the Father made when He redeemed us from the curse of the Law through His Son, Jesus. We wholly submit our lives to Christ as our Head and honour the example in Scripture.

General support, as named in our teams' budget, helps provide yarn for the prayer shawl ministry, birthday cards and stamps for the 55+ who are single or widowed, and grief support books.

Flowers for the families of members who passed away, condolence cards, visitation, calls, and prayers go out on a regular basis as we do our best to support and check in on those who have lost loved ones. If you have it in your heart to help in this area, we would love to hear from you!

Thank you to the wonderful people who faithfully serve, and have served in the past, on this team.

More team members are needed as Pastor Rick begins a season of rest after eight years, Dennis has given two full terms, and Karin one term.

We have so much appreciation for you who give to the Benevolent Fund, as well as those who work with us in many other ways – the Lord bless you.

Thank you so much to all of you for how much time you gave to the church this year.

We held our first worship training conference this year offering talks and seminars with two invited speakers: Dale Dirksen, who facilitated our worship training session last year, and Bob Williamson from Horizon College, where he trains student worship teams. elsewhere in this report Wilma is asking for congregational approval to join the board and while we are sad to lose her from our committee, we know she'll be great on the

church board. Bob is looking forward to a break from committee meetings for a while. Both will continue to be key members of our worship teams. That leaves us with several places to fill. If you're reading this before the AGM then you still have time to put your name forward to volunteer for any of the committees. Family Ministries - Joanne Thomas



At Cornerstone Church we believe that Family Ministry is more than just programs. It is the process of equipping parents to engage actively in the discipleship of their children. In relationship, it is our goal in Family Ministries to aid in equipping parents/adults as we recognize that they are the number one spiritual influencer in their child's life. It is also our desire to share the love and hope of Jesus with the community and everyone we encounter daily.

We are committed to providing biblically sound and engaging age-appropriate teaching on Sunday mornings. On average we have around 40 - 60 children each week. We are so very thankful for our amazing volunteers who are serving so faithfully (monthly during the service and weekly during Sunday School). Having consistent leaders each week truly allows us to gain trust and build relationships with the children.

Our continued desire is for children to learn how to worship with adults in the Sunday services, and for that reason, we only provide children's programming up to

grade one during the service, and for those age four to grade one, they can join the entire congregation for the last part of the service each week. We recognize that our children are learning to worship together with the entire congregation and the challenges that can bring. Many of the children are still learning (or are still unable) to read, so song lyrics, congregational reading responses, etc. are all incredibly difficult for them to engage in. Because of that, we have added a 'Kid's Moment' song each week of the service. We encourage the children to come to the front and worship with actions to a song that is relevant for their age. Having the children take part in the service also provides opportunities for parents/adults to take an active role in teaching, and partaking in communion together, observing baptism, child dedications, etc.

Highlights:

Tot Time: This fall, Tot time returned! This is an open gym time for pre-schoolers that happens every Tuesday morning. Big shout out to Becca McKee and Kaitlyn Streilein for leading this time!

Trunk or Treat: In 2020 and 2021, due to COVID regulations, we could not run our traditional indoor carnival, so instead we ran an outdoor trick or treating event in our parking lot. The response from the community was amazing, so we decided to stick with it! This year we saw approximately four hundred children come as well as



their parents/grandparents/adults too! It was a wonderful opportunity to meet new people from our neighbourhood, as most were from our community! Because we are intentional in finding ways to connect with the community after Trunk or Treat, we have already had contact with some of those families again, whether that be through other events/ programs or our mid-week and Sunday morning services.

Movie Nights: Our movie nights are attended mostly

by those in our community and have helped many to remove any discomfort about entering our building. We have had wonderful conversations with people, and with some we have continued to see them in our mid-week programs, which is exciting!

Cornerstone Library: We have so many fantastic resources in our libraries! The adult and youth library is located just off the main floor lobby and the children's library is in the CE wing upstairs. There are many new resources in both of these libraries and if there is ever something you would like to have in the library, please contact us and we would be happy to order it.

Child Dedications:

Four families dedicated five children in 2022. In these services, parents

publicly proclaim their desire to teach their children about God, and to model a relationship with Jesus to their children. It is an amazing time of prayer and love for our families.

Missions & Service - Michael Streilein

One of the many reasons I love Cornerstone Church is its desire to have an impact, and partner with others for the advancement of the gospel. Though 2022 has had financial challenges for Cornerstone as a church, we were blessed to continue strong partnership and support for the organizations we work with. Cornerstone has a long lasting legacy of support for many mission organizations, both locally and globally, and serving on the Missions and Service Team gives us a first hand look at these partnerships which is such a privilege.

As a team, our mandate is "to promote and encourage hospitality within the congregation, and missions and service locally and abroad." This is a big responsibility! There are so many amazing mission organizations, and deciding which ones to highlight and partner with can be difficult. We are thankful for the trust Cornerstone puts in our team as we prayerfully discern these opportunities. Though we have many amazing partnerships, I would like to highlight just a few from this past year.

In January George & Tobia Veith, Cornerstone's longest missionary partners, officially retired. They had served faithfully in China for the past 3 decades, and we have been privileged to be a part of their ministry during that time. Thank you to George and Tobia for following God's call and for

Facility & Finance - Julie Tsui

What is another word for unprecedented? It means “never done or known before”. I realize that word has been overused since 2020, but because of that definition, it is the best word to use to describe this past year financially for Cornerstone Church. In my 17 years of attendance, the church has never known a financially lean year like this.

We started off the 2022 year with a major project to upgrade the church’s network system. This upgrade improved the church’s ability to live-stream Sunday morning services with fewer technical issues. Other budgeted enhancements: replacing balcony and emergency lights and installing a new door to the gymnasium storage room.

By June, it was apparent that this was not a normal financial year for us. At this point, all ministry teams and staff did their best to cut back on spending while endeavoring to provide meaningful and purposeful programming. As mentioned in the fall communications, year to date giving was not meeting even the cut back expenses, and the congregation was invited to pray for God’s provision. At the time of this writing, year to date giving at the end of November was \$499,300. This is 75% of the 2022 budget. To break even with expenses, we are trusting God for \$147,500 to

come in the month of December.

Looking into 2023, you will see that the proposed budget is less than the 2022 budget. Non-essential projects are being postponed. The only “major” operational project for the 2023 year is to install door magnets on the fire doors. A recent fire inspection disallowed doors to be kept open with manual door stops. The door magnets will allow the heavy doors to remain open, but automatically release them should a fire erupt to provide the protection needed.

Amid this challenging year, we have much to be thankful for.

Thankful for volunteers. They have always been an essential element to Cornerstone. We want to take this opportunity to thank everyone who participated in snow shovelling, the spring clean-up day and small maintenance tasks. To my fellow committee members, Jeremy Petkau, Sam Janzen and Dale Meginbir thanks for going the extra mile this year. Dale provides invaluable IT expertise to the team. Sam has volunteered many hours with loft renovations that addressed fire and building code matters. This has really been a year of electrical projects, and we are truly thankful for the many volunteer hours that Kendall Adrian and Jeremy

Patkau put in to address these. And to Dave Katz who volunteers many hours in the important role of recording funds received and issuing charitable receipts. Thanks Dave!

Thankful for staff. Our church administrative and custodial staff are vital supports to the work of the ministry. We couldn’t function without our staff. Now that the restrictions have lifted, our facilities are seeing an increase in usage including rentals from various organizations. Noah and Jen Wilson work hard to keep the church facilities clean in the midst of increased usage demands. Thanks for all you do.

Regrettably, however, we must say goodbye to a couple of the staff that work closely with our committee. Kathy Janzen is resigning at the end of December after 28+ years of service as Administrative Assistant. Elsa Guenther resigned the beginning of December after faithfully serving as church administrator for the past ten years. She has been the right arm of our committee. We are so grateful for everything you ladies have done over the years, and while we are sad to see you go, we wish you both every blessing in your new journeys.

We want to express our appreciation to all of those who have continued to

support the church financially and in prayer during these tough economic times. We recognized this has also been a financially difficult year for many in our church family and our prayers are extended to you.

And finally, we are thankful to our God. Thankful that in the hard times, He is faithful, the One who says, ‘I will never leave you or forsake you’. Thankful that when we don’t understand, He says ‘Trust in the Lord, and don’t depend on your own understanding’. Thankful that when we feel overwhelmed, He says ‘Come to Me, you who are weary and heavy laden’. Thankful that when we are perplexed, He says, ‘Ask for wisdom and I will give it to you’. Thankful for His great love, for He says, ‘I love you with an everlasting love’, and ‘Nothing can separate you from My love’.

Although, the 2022 year has been a hard year, as we face 2023 may we humble ourselves and allow God to work in us as follows:

“Now all glory to God, who is able, through His mighty power at work within us, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think. Glory to Him in the church and in Christ Jesus through all generations forever and ever! Amen.” Eph. 3:20-21

I am happy to be writing this report, and not beginning with the gloom and doom of Covid-19! We have survived, we have had our times of loneliness, but the sun shines. We are able to go about and visit, have meals together, enjoy recreation, worship together in the Fellowship Centre, and enjoy activities created by staff.

Many times, the Board, and our Executive Director, have been asked about vacant suites related through the time of Covid-19. This was a real concern of the Board, and staff was challenged with ways to try to bring people in, especially to occupy our one-bedroom suites. Decline in the severity of Covid-19 and much effort given by staff has aided us to fill those suites. This line in our financial report was a concern, as you can well imagine. We had not experienced empty suites to this magnitude before.

The Audit & Finance Committee, together with staff, have worked hard on spending restraints, in an effort to work towards a balanced budget for 2022.

We wish to thank the New Horizons for Seniors grant that we obtained in 2022, which provides opportunities for activities and programs for our residents.

Our upcoming year will have challenges due to inflation in many costs handed to us. Food prices have

skyrocketed by 11% or more, cost of maintenance supplies has also risen significantly, as have other key expenditures. As a board, together with our management staff, we are cognizant of the fact that seniors' benefit rates have not kept up to inflation. Therefore, we are trying to be as mindful and cautious as we can to maintain a balanced budget.

Hard decisions are challenging. As many of you know, Saskatoon Mennonite Care Services Inc. (SMCSI) has had a long relationship with the Mennonite Historical Society of Saskatchewan (MHSS). It has been an amicable relationship for 25 years and can hopefully continue. We had a 20-year agreement in place for rental space and 20 years has come to an end. Management at SMCSI has determined that our need for storage and maintenance workspace has become critical. Fire regulations are also a factor. As a result, the need to take back some space from MHSS will cause them to adjust and perhaps find additional space elsewhere. My hope and prayers are that we can continue to help each other. Perhaps one of our sponsoring churches has additional room? If so, please contact one of the MHSS board members.
